The focus on brownfields revitalization helps instill the concept of environmental protection and reuse and leads to increased benefits in Indian Country.

#### Administer and implement the TRP Four Elements.

- 1.) Timely Survey & Inventory of Brownfield Sites.
- 2.) Oversight & Enforcement Authorities or Other mechanisms & Resources.
- 3.) Mechanism & Resources to Provide Meaningful Opportunities for Public Participation.
- 4.) Mechanisms for Approval of a Cleanup Plan & Verification & Certification that Clean-up are Complete and establishment of a Public Record.
  - Develop and approve RFP's.
  - Manage/oversee contracts.
  - Prepare Property Profile Forms.
  - Obtain Training as needed and available.
  - Inspect sites within the exterior boundaries of the Lower Brule Sioux Reservation.
  - Resolve issues, concerns and complaints.
  - Assists and provide technical assistance when necessary to EPA, Tribal Law Enforcement,
     Tribal Programs and the Tribal Council.
  - Write quarterly, mid and end year reports dues to EPA.
  - Maintain Public Record for the Tribal Response Program.

Remember, not all sites that handle chemicals or petroleum are Brownfields. But sites with real or perceived contamination (such as a release to the environment) and where there is a potential for expansion, redevelopment, or reuse, may be a Brownfields.

#### Brownfields sites might include:

Old industrial properties – gas and service stations – dumps – meth labs – old schools or buildings with asbestos – old dry cleaners – pulp mills – wood treatment operations – railroad sites – former Department of Defense sites – farms/ranches – abandoned buildings – BIA Facilities – sites with black mold – junk yards – old refineries – mine-scarred land.
